Dear Parents / Carers,

Welcome back and a happy new year to all!

In Language and other areas of the curriculum we are going to be using our Enterprise Project - Puppets - to help support the development of all areas in language - reading, writing, talking and listening as well as having cross curricular links. See below for further details.

Our Core Reading will continue within the classroom and everyone also has an Accelerated Reading book which they take between home and school. Please support your child with all aspects of their reading by asking questions about their book and sharing parts or even the entire story with them.

Maths Setting will continue Monday - Thursday and your child will receive their Maths Homework Challenge from their Setting teacher.

Class homework will be given out on a Monday and expected in by the Friday unless otherwise stated - some Homework Challenges this term may need more than 1 week to complete but full instructions will accompany the challenges when they are issued. If you do find you need any extra advice or support please don't hesitate to get in touch with me.

Our topics this term include our whole school topic on Emotional Literacy's Fresh Start. Our main topic will be the Enterprise Topic with your child working collaboratively to produce and perform a puppet show for parents and younger classes. Also, the group that your child is in will contribute to the storyline, scenery, props and dialogue involved with that play. If you have any books, pictures etc related to our topic and would be willing to share them with the school, please send them in with your child.

The class will use the ICT suite with Mrs Bell on a Wednesday.

Please ensure your child has a full PE kit in school every day so we can all make the most use of our gym time. We have a weekly Hall time as well as our blocks of work with the school PE Specialist.

We will be working with the Drama Specialist, Mrs Burdon, on a Thursday during the blocks when we don't have PE.

We will continue to use the shared areas outside the classrooms for Health and Wellbeing, Art, Music, Drama and other activities such as Circle Time.

Your child will have a 'talking partner' to work with, at times, in the class. These partners will be changed on a regular basis so please ask your child who their current 'talking partner' is. All pupils also have the opportunity to regularly work in a 'trio'. The roles in a 'trio' are Reporter, Recorder and Checker - ask your child which roles they have taken on. Much of our assessment will be done formatively and the children will be heavily involved in peer and self assessment. Children will have opportunities to experience Active Learning across the curriculum and will be able to share what they have learned and how they have learned it with you. Once again, ask your child about this - explaining things to you helps them to learn.

We are looking forward to having the opportunity to share our Personal Learning Plan successes with you at a later date in the term. Thank you to all parents and carers who attended the PLP morning last term, I know the pupils enjoyed sharing their targets and achievements with you and each other.

As A Curriculum for Excellence continues to be developed throughout the school, all pupils should be able to tell you about the Four Capacities - Responsible Citizens, Confident Individual, Successful Learners and Effective Contributors. Do you know what they mean? Have you asked your child? Go on - you will be surprised at how much they know!
